## WE ARE ONE IN THE SPIRIT

*I do not pray for these only, but also for those who believe in me through their word, that they may all be one; even as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that thou hast sent me. The glory which thou hast given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and thou in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that thou hast sent me and hast loved them even as thou hast loved me. ## BOXERS OR BRIEFS?

During the recent presidential campaign, a reporter asked candidate Obama, "Do you wear boxers or briefs?" He replied, "I don't answer humiliating questions but I assure you whatever I wear, I look good in them." That came to mind recently when considering the disciple to rabbi relationship. Saul (Paul) had such a relationship with Gamaliel.

The disciple's job is simple but profoundly difficult to become the rabbi. The way that happens is a long-term commitment to intimacy and transformation. If Rabbi Gamaliel always clears his throat before answering, the

disciple does the same. If Rabbi Gamaliel sleeps on his side instead of his back, cuts his meat with his left hand or says "Gesundheit" instead "God bless you", the disciple learns to do the same. If Rabbi Gamaliel wears boxers, the disciple abandons his briefs.

He learns all these things through close and intimate observation. More than externals, the disciples learns to think like, react to and feel like Rabbi Gamaliel. When the disciple one day becomes the rabbi, he will constantly reflect back to Rabbi Gamaliel as his

## WE ARE ONE IN THE SPIRIT

He says in the verses above that Jesus plus the Father plus those who believe equals one. One!! We are all one in the body of Christ with one leader, one person in charge, Jesus Christ.

Jesus knew that the 12 disciples needed someone to be in charge. Someone had to be the leader. And that leader was Him. There could not be one chosen successor to Jesus. His message had to go forth. It had to go forth as a light in the darkness, as a gift in a world sorely lacking in love.

It was the message of Jesus, told in His words, in the story of His life. A single successor might be deified, might become the focal point for all the love and faith people had for Jesus. And so, there were 12 disciples, 12 teachers, 12 messengers, 12 men who would be cowering, hiding behind locked doors, fearing for their lives, silenced.

We sometimes forget that we need someone in charge, someone we can turn to. We need more than a com-

mittee. A committee can never win the hearts of people. A committee can never inspire passion. A committee can never lead as a light shining in the darkness.

We need to be one, we need to support each other, we need to remind each other of the story of faith. When one falters, another is there to support. When one falls, another is there to stand in the breach and to pick up their fallen comrade.

God wants us to seek and find His living Word in the witness of a brother/sister, in the mouth of a man/woman. Therefore, the Christian needs another Christian who speaks God's Word to him. He needs him again and again when he becomes uncertain and discouraged, for by himself he cannot help himself without belying their truth.

As we walk with Jesus it rubs off on those around us. As we walk with Jesus as our guide, our life is fulfilled. He touches us and then we

authority.

To become the rabbi is the passion of the disciple's life. Two first century principles exemplify this relationship: "cover yourself in the dust of your rabbi's feet" and "drink in their words thirstily." Validation came when an outsider could say by observation, that man is a disciple of Rabbi Gamaliel.

Isn't that to be our goal? To become like our Rabbi Jesus? We must also live by covering ourselves "in the dust of our rabbi's feet" and "drink in His words thirstily." These word pictures

urge us to follow as closely as we can, wherever He goes. Conversely, they admonish us not to hang back.

Intimacy and transformation are the heart of discipleship. Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote in The Cost of Discipleship, "When we are called to follow Christ, we are summoned to an exclusive attachment to His person." What is the purpose of this attachment? Intimacy and transformation. For us this is also simple but profoundly difficult. The last thing our sinful nature wants to do is lie down and die. If Jesus wore boxers, our sinful nature would stubbornly cling

to briefs.

How do we overcome our resistance? Structure, discipline, accountability, and transparency. Where do we find these things? Reunion groups and Ultreyas, but they are not enough. It takes one more thing: commitment. We need to rouse ourselves from our comfortable ways of following, from our complacency, and cover ourselves in the dust of our Rabbi.

## **WOMEN'S KERYX #5 - HURON VALLEY CORRECTIONAL FACILITY**

We are all familiar with "Jesus is the Good Shepherd" in John 10. When reading it today, verse 16 jumped out at me. It reads, "I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd." I know that the "other sheep" is referring to the non-Jews at that time, but today it speaks to me of the men and women incarcerated in prisons everywhere. Keryx #5 had a mighty impact on the women of Huron Valley Correctional Facility, as well as both the inside and outside teams. The girls were so touched by the love, grace, and forgiveness of Jesus and they did listen to His voice. Proof of this was at the Closing of Keryx #5. Here are some notes that I took so that you would have an idea of the growth that was made during the weekend. God surely used the inside and outside teams in a mighty way! God is so good and so faithful!

- I'm free! I want to feel God's love all the time and share it. God IS love!
- I was taught what true Godly love is! I didn't think that I deserved better. Now, I'm excited about what God has planned for me.
- The Palanca bags are a reminder of all that we gained.
- I felt more love than I thought possible from God. I feel light and refreshed now!
- Now I will be able to help others come to Christ.
- I am full of joy! I will hold this weekend in my heart for the rest of my life. I AM blessed!

- When I first came here, all I could think about was that I was abused – beat, molested, raped. I felt I was no good. I tried to cover my pain with drugs. I lost my children. I lost my mom to drugs. I felt worthless. NOW, I feel loved and chosen. I am free. Now I'm on a mission to change myself. I will stop the inner lies.
- The ice around my heart melted.
- I gave my concerns to God and now I feel lighter.
- I'm not a victim any more. Now I'm a survivor! (This was repeated many times.)
- As I walk around the Compound, I'm going to play back (in my mind) all that I heard. (Then this woman jumped straight up in the air and yelled, "Whoopee!")
- I'm free of bondage. I felt the love of God. I was able to talk to a person and tell them how I feel and forgive them even though I might not forget.
- I felt love and was able to let go of things buried deep inside.
- A ray of sunshine filled my soul and spread out on the Compound. Now I'm going to pay it forward!
- I made a giant step – I accepted Christ into my heart! I feel at peace.
- I came into a room of "wall crushers" and received unconditional love as my wall came down. I learned it's ok to let people in, let go and let God. I'm cleansed!
- I came in carrying baggage. I rebuked Satan and now I'm super blessed!
- We did some cookin' with Jesus. I'm a work in progress. I feel hopeful, better, and content.
- I felt alone before I came here.

Now I know I'm not alone. I have God and prayers from all over. I felt an aura of love.

- I spent my whole life in church but I never accepted God until now.
- I came in broken and struggling in my walk with Jesus – hungry for knowledge. Now I feel the love of Christ. My spirit is lifted. I'm not alone. I can love myself.
- I'm going to stop tearing down and start building up.
- My anger and the million pounds of burdens on my shoulders are lifted like a fog being lifted – I just let it go. My Bible will be out now.
- My walls are broken down. I'm a survivor. I have a new beginning!
- This was NOT a "Jesus 101" class! This was a sumptuous feast with Jesus!
- I learned how to give and not to always have to receive.
- My mom's inside this prison, too. She needs to do a Keryx.
- I am NOT forgotten!

If you haven't been part of a Keryx team, you might want to prayerfully consider it. God can really use you. You WILL be blessed in so many ways and if you are like me, your faith will be strengthened beyond measure.

**KERYX RE-ENTRY RETREAT**

Dear Christian Community,

In October 2009 the first ever Keryx Re-entry Retreat was held at the Tuscola facility in Caro for short-term parolees. There were 40 candidates and 35 volunteers from our community. After the weekend, the administration was asked if they wanted to schedule another weekend. The answer was ABSOLUTELY.

We scheduled the next one for May 2010. When forming the team many other Keryx weekends were going on at the same time, so we were limited with experienced team members; but as with all of God's plans, He provided nine first time volunteers from this community as well as first time

ex-offenders on this team.

When meeting with the facility staff, my co-rector Bill Brown and I heard the superintendent proclaim that only one of the candidates from the first weekend in Oct. had returned for parole violation. Praise God for His grace and direction in their lives.

On our #2 team, we had ex-offenders sharing their 4<sup>th</sup> day experience and Christian community action in their lives. After 30 years of prison volunteering with the Keryx Prison Ministry, it was a blessing to see the fruits of God's leadership in the many weekends throughout the various prisons in Michigan. There were seven graduates of Keryx serving as Cha-

Chos from this facility, each one a willing servant of God, anxious to be sharing the love of Jesus that was shown to them when they made their weekend.

One of the first-time volunteers said in a letter he wrote after the weekend, "I did get to witness some lives turn to Christ. Lots of seeds were planted. So how many lives were changed? One I know of for sure—MINE! As for the rest, I leave you with this passage, Matthew 13: 3-9"

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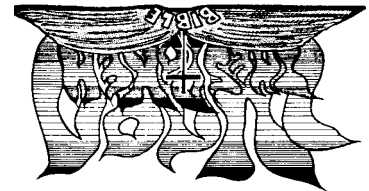

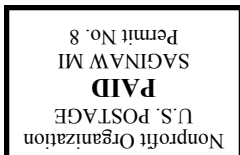
